## Description

Healthwatch City of London trained volunteers visit health and adult social care services to see how they are run. This is called 'Enter and View' and Healthwatch City of London trains volunteers to be 'authorised representatives' to carry out these visits. Due to Coivd-19 the ability to perform such visits has diminished. This newly created role will require volunteers to carry out 'mystery shops' on a given subject area or service. By telephoning and carrying out online research of the service providers to obtain information on their provision, making observations our volunteers will write up their findings, produce a report with recommendations for improvement and highlight best practice to share with our community.

Purpose of the Role	<ul> <li>To carry out mystery shops on given health and social care services and report observations to Healthwatch City of London (HWCoL)</li> </ul>
Key Activities	<ul> <li>To carry out, report and review mystery shops.</li> <li>Make observations following an agreed format</li> </ul>

Chat to service providers to obtain the latest information on their service provision and write their responses in an agreed template (HWCoL will give guidance and support) • Type up your own observations and notes Propose recommendations on the basis of the findings, in production of the report The commitment for a mystery shop will depend on the type of service being investigated. This will be discussed and agreed with you in advance Basic literacy skills, ability to Essential skills and make notes/record Knowledge observations Good observation skills (visual and/or listening) Attitudes and Values Ability to work as part of the Healthwatch City of London team As a part of our volunteer team you will be brought into direct contact with patients, residents, carers, service users, staff and members of the public. It is an important, sensitive and complex role, therefore you will asked you to comply with the HWCoL Code of Conduct Be guided by Healthwatch staff Committed to giving people a voice
