I also intend to start a 'Hot chocolate with the Headteacher' next half-term. More information will be shared when we have confirmed all plans and all the criteria for each award. I am meeting with the School Council pupils soon to discuss behaviour awards and the existing Rocket points.				
<ul> <li>More children's work on displays</li> </ul>	I have very high expectations when it comes to the learning environment. In the Summer Term, I am working with staff on 'Displays and our learning environment' in readiness for the new academic year.				
<ul> <li>Cleaner classrooms</li> </ul>	I am a big fan of tidying up and de-cluttering. Staff have been amazing in helping me to tidy up the school. In the Summer holiday, we will decorate the KS 2 building and tidy up all classrooms with more focussed displays. Mrs Stevens has spoken to the cleaners regarding our expectations as well.
